Chairman Ruiz-Mesa read the Sunshine Law.

Chairman Ruiz-Mesa called for the Financial Report from Avena's office. Linda Cavallo reviewed the Financial Report for the six months ended March 21, 2015.

Chairman Ruiz-Mesa requested the Executive Administrative Report. Mrs. Jones stated the VHA attained a high performer status for the year-ending September 30, 2014. High performer status is difficult to achieve. The Authority received a score of 94 out of 100. This is the highest it has ever received. There were a couple of years that were a little difficult due to physical inspections at the high rises.

The union contract draft is being reviewed. It is anticipated to be brought to the board next month for approval. Mrs. Jones understands Mr. Gabage will not be at that meeting, but she will have it for him to review in advance. The Authority's labor attorney, Mike Watson, will be attending the meeting to review the union contract agreement. Any concerns Mr. Gabage may have will the addressed prior to the meeting.

Mrs. Jones reported the audit is ongoing and moving smoothly.

The Kidston and Olivio parking lot replacement project will start next week. This will take approximately 8-10 days and the residents will be notified prior to the start of the project.

Mrs. Jones updated the Board in regards to Melrose Court. The Federal Home Loan Bank awarded \$263,500 to help finance the construction. The sponsoring bank for that application was Capital Bank of New Jersey who is also the purchaser of the tax credits for the project. The houses are going up and pictures of the start of the project were made available for the Board to review.

Mrs. Jones explained the Congregate Housing Services Program is a program funded by the State and some of the VHA's residents choose to participate in it. It includes a meal a day, shopping services, light housing keeping and/or laundry services. It is a program that is subsidized by the State. The funding is from the casino profits and the budget continues to shrink due to the casino issues in Atlantic City. The VHA is maintaining the program and getting funded. This resolution is to acknowledge that the VHA is in compliance with the HIPPA act and that the VHA has its own legal counsel if needed.
